Author Caroline Rau went to Kenya through a service opportunity she read about in her college newsletter.

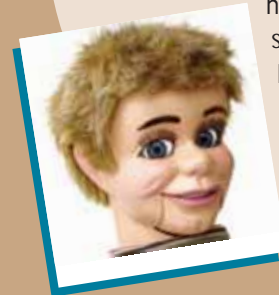
